Re: Fall Season Begins - Colorado Field Restrictions

Dear CSA Members,

There were a couple of CSA sanctioned soccer tournaments last weekend, and I am happy to report that everything went well! Soccer players can finally get on the fields and join the multitude of other sports that have returned to play for an exciting fall season. While we are happy to get the season started, we must also keep safety as a top priority.

Rules and guidelines are created to help keep players and families safe. So, as we return to the soccer fields, we ask that EVERYONE PLEASE abide by all major restrictions throughout the state. Each soccer field in Colorado has its own unique restrictions in place, based on the county the field is in; it is our responsibility to follow those restrictions.

In order to simplify, CSA has composed a [Colorado Soccer Field COVID Restrictions Document](#). The document was designed to **provide one location for clubs and their membership to view all field expectations and restrictions across the state**. Because field restrictions vary by location and may change throughout the season, **you will need to check the field restrictions document BEFORE you head out to ANY game**, even if you are re-visiting a field from a week ago. If the field you are going to is not listed in the document, please check with your opponent club.

**Lastly, I would like to personally ask that everyone PLEASE take this seriously; there will be zero tolerance for anybody not following field restrictions. You and your players risk being dismissed!** Clubs, PLEASE work with Technical Directors, Coaches, Managers, Parents and Players, etc. Remind everyone that they NEED to be respectful and NEED to follow rules. **It will only take ONE bad COACH, PLAYER, ADMIN, REFEREE or PARENT to cancel the entire season for all of us. YOU DO NOT WANT TO BE THAT PERSON!**

Let us do our part to make this fall soccer season a success; be sure to check your fields.
